We believe in making public engagement inclusive and impactful. This at-home workshop kit provides an easy and accessible way for people to share their thoughts, allowing us to gather diverse input from the Stoughton community in a manner that's both convenient and comfortable.

» Who

Gather a small group of individuals. Hosting an intimate conversation allows you to exchange ideas and build upon each other's experiences.

» When

Whenever it works for you! Choose a time when everyone has about an hour to take part, and keep in mind that this is open to people of all ages. Feel free to involve the entire family!

» Where

Pick a location where you feel at ease. We suggest your home or another quiet spot where everyone can hear each other clearly during the conversation.

» How

Send a scan of the responses to info@ beckerproservices.com or drop them off at Becker Professional Services (183 W. Main St. Stoughton, WI) by November 20th, 2025 so we can review your feedback.

» Start

Ask everyone to introduce themselves (if needed, as some of you may already be familiar with each other), sign in, and begin with an icebreaker activity. Here are some suggestions:

- What is your favorite spot in Stoughton?
- How long have you called Stoughton home?
- If Stoughton had a theme song, what would it be?
- In 20 years, I'll be...

» Guidelines

Set some common guidelines for a productive (and enjoyable) discussion.

- Engage! Be present and listen to everyone. For those who tend to speak up more, consider stepping back a bit. For quieter participants, don't hesitate to speak up.
- Respect! You're all here because you care about Stoughton's future. Listen with an open mind and a desire to learn. Disagreements are natural—get curious and ask questions to better understand each other's viewpoints. There's no need to reach a resolution, but gaining insight into different perspectives is valuable.
- Enjoy the process!

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Support Housing Needs

The city aims to increase housing diversity by allowing mixed-use developments, multi-family housing, and smaller lot sizes. Efforts to streamline the development process and utilize financial incentives (e.g., TIF funding, grants) are being explored to reduce approval times and cost Stoughton is home to people of diverse ages, backgrounds, incomes, and abilities that all influence their unique housing needs. 






Support Housing Needs

What opportunities and challenges do you see in these spaces?


